PLEASE KNEEL OR BE SEATED.

We thank you, loving Father, because, when we turned away, you sent Jesus, your Son. He gave his life for us on the cross and shows us the way to live. By the power of your Holy Spirit may these gifts of bread and wine be for us Christ's body and his blood.

On the night before he died, when darkness had fallen, Jesus took bread, gave you thanks, broke it, and shared it with his disciples, saying: "Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

After they had eaten, he took the cup of wine, gave you thanks, and shared it with his disciples, saying:

"Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

So Father, with this bread and this cup we celebrate his love, his death, his risen life. As you feed us with these your gifts, fill us with your Holy Spirit, and change us more and more to be like Jesus our Saviour. #### The Lord's Prayer

The presider and those assisting him will receive first, followed by the choir and then the rest of the congregation.

#### Notes on this evening's Readings

Isaiah 52:7-10 The prophet has urged the people to rise out of their despondency. They are in exile and yearn to return to Jerusalem. They believe that God has deserted them for their infidelity. Now God speaks: my people will know about me; "therefore in that day they shall know that it is I who speak: here am I".

<u>Hebrews 1:1-4</u> Hebrews stresses the importance of salvation through Christ – perhaps to Jewish Christians who were tempted to return to Judaism, or to Jews who were interested in becoming Christian. Christ is the perfect priest: he is *mediator* between the Father and humans and *purifies* us of our sins.

John 1:1-14 John wrote his account of the gospel so that we "may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah [the Christ], the Son of God, and that through believing we may have life in his name". John begins with a summary of the faith. © *1996-2022 Chris Haslam*
