## **Mission Projects Update**

We are still accepting donations for our **Shepherd's Cupboard** and will make every effort to get these in the hands of those in need. Thank you for your continued support of this mission.

Please note that we are still accepting clothing and small household items for the Hillcrest Baptist **Caring Closet**. Please keep this mission in mind as you change over to your Fall/Winter wardrobe. Volunteers continue to transfer the items to Hillcrest Baptist on a regular basis.

Please remember the **West Side Food Bank** and their clients in your prayers. You can donate to them directly or through an offering – just make sure to note on your envelope that the monies are designated for the food bank. At the end of the month the Church sends these donations to the food bank. Please leave any food items for the food bank in the small bench just inside the main doors. A volunteer will transport these to the food bank.

In April we received word that **Beacon Cove**, the youth shelter on St. James Street, was critically low on toiletries. Thanks to LIFT, we were able to spend \$500 on toiletries at Costco and deliver them to the shelter. The coordinators were incredibly happy and told us they have five emergency shelter beds available along with the ten beds for their longer-term residents. Beacon Cove is a beautiful facility and a wonderful place for vulnerable youth to find stability in a safe environment. The youth at the shelter also spread kindness by taking supplies to other homeless teenagers.





#### **Christmas Baskets - 2023**

The top tier of the Sanctuary floor was removed, and carpet re-installed to make it safer for Clergy and Lay readers to navigate around the Altar. Many thanks to Shayne and Barry for taking on this and many other projects around the church this summer.

#### **FINANCE UPDATE**

As forecasted in the annual budget at the AGM, and in the Easter Newsletter, we are continuing to see near break-even results due to having a part-time rector and the energy cost savings from the natural gas conversion.

Financial results for the end of August are currently showing a small loss of \$408, with a forecast to end the year with a surplus of \$9,735.

As reported earlier in this newsletter, we have a number of building related costs this year. In addition to the natural gas conversion costs, the sanctuary updates, new shed and the upcoming roof updates will all need to be funded from the building fund and the operating memorial fund, with any additional funds required to be funded from the capital memorial fund. If your personal situation allows, please consider making additional donations to help replenish the building and memorial funds.
