

ADVENT/CHRISTMAS 2023



Dear fellow members of the Good Shepherd church ~

In Advent we look back and we look ahead.

We look back to the first coming, the first Advent, of Jesus in the celebration of the nativity of our Lord at Christmas. We look ahead to the second coming, the second Advent, of Christ's glorious return.

Yet, we live now with more than mere sentimental recollections about Jesus' birth, with more than wistful pining for his return. Within the bookends of Christ's first and second coming we are to experience the extravagant grace of knowing Christ now, of being in Christ, by baptism and through faith. Even with seeming ever-lurking Covid-19 still about us, and devastating persistent wars on our planet, we still have hope. The power of this hope is that it is grounded in a person and not in an idea or a plan or a spiritual notion; it is in Christ Jesus *himself*, in knowing him, no matter the circumstances.

In these Advents of our Lord, we recognize the work of our great God, whose ways are far higher than ours. When we ponder these things, we cannot but be humble, penitent, joyfully awestruck. Advent's call to penitential anticipation, which is not a grovelling in our sin, but rather it's the life-giving process of lining up our lives with that of Jesus Christ, our brother and our King, our friend and our Lord - it's the way of freedom and hope.



Let's take this Advent opportunity to square our lives afresh with the One who is "God with us", Immanuel. We rejoice, with hearts sharpened by our penitence, that "as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name" and that we have the privilege of being a number of those children. As daughters and sons of God it is our cherished calling to willfully bow before our Bethlehem-born Lord in adoration.

"The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth." This is absolutely amazing! Think on it, and believe it, deep within your soul.

A Blessed Advent and a Happy Christmas to you and yours.

Mission Projects Update

The **Shepherd's Cupboard** and **Caring Closet** missions remain active. We also continue to support the **West Side Food Bank.** Thank you for continued support with these missions and please keep them and all those who are in need in your prayers.

Lunch program, has been running since November 6, 2023. A group of volunteers sprang into action to the urgent call to provide 50 brown bag lunches each week for the most vulnerable students at Harbourview High School. Each Sunday (except Monday holidays) a rotation of volunteer's pack 50 lunches which include a ham and cheese sandwich, a fruit or veggie snack, another snack such as a granola bar, and a juice box. These are then delivered Monday morning to the school's main office where the resource teacher will distribute to those in most need.

Our goal is to ensure this program is sustainable and consistent longterm.

How can you help?

- 1. There is a restricted account set up to receive donations.
- 2. You can also donate non-perishables such as the juice boxes or granola bars.
- 3. You can volunteer to help assemble the lunches. This commitment is only 1 hour once every 4-6 weeks.
- 4. Don't see yourself making sandwiches? Maybe some of the shopping or lunch delivery to the school is more appealing to you!

FINANCE UPDATE

We are continuing to forecast a small surplus for the end of the year. It has, however, dropped slightly from the projected surplus we reported in Sept. This is due in part to a small decrease in forecasted revenues and a small increase in building related costs.

Financial results for the end of Nov. are currently showing a small loss of \$2,006, with a forecast to end the year of a surplus of \$4,640, an improvement of \$20,000 over last year's results as we continue to reap the financial benefits of having a part-time rector and the energy cost savings from the natural gas conversion.

AED Now Available

A grant from our Diocesan Synod has enabled the purchase of an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) which is mounted in the hallway. Did you know:



In 1956 the Creche was presented to St. George's Church in loving memory of Charles Mark Waring, son of G. Ernst Waring. The figures were purchased in England and shipped to Saint John by ocean freighter. They passed through Canadian Customs where it was decided that Jesus, Mary, and Joseph would be duty free while all the other figures were taxable.

When the figures finally arrived at St. George's, work had begun on an appropriate display, a stable, to house them.



To maintain authenticity, it was decided no nails would be used in the construction, only wood pins, like those used in Christ's day. Also, the roof would be thatched like those of 2000 years ago. Thatching material was gathered from marshy areas around the Saint John River at South Bay. This was soaked in fireproofing solution, and dried. After some time, the roof was replaced with cedar shingles which remain in place today. Re-dedication of the creche happened in 1996 after repairs to the figures and creche were completed.




